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

"Having traveled many places both overseas and within Australia, I think Burnie is a great place to live. My main concern with Burnie is the lower socioeconomic class who reside here and their attitude of expecting everything for nothing. Burnie has a lot of positives, however a great deal of these people focus on the negatives and have unrealistic expectations of what can be offered. Unfortunately there is nothing which can be done about Burnie's large bogan population, however they do make it less desirable to reside here, eg, when you can't walk through town without almost walking through a fight, breathing in their smoke or BO, or go to West Beach without them leaving their KFC packaging lying about on the grass. No one minds them enjoying Burnie's public areas, however they make it unpleasant for others. I think Burnie's CBD would be more attractive if there were less empty shops. I think advertising what is on in Burnie would also help bring people to the CBD. I often attend the trivia night at the Beach Hotel of a Thursday 2017evening, which is free and sometimes there is barely 4 teams, yet people complain there is 11-11 nothing on and nothing to do. The same occurs within sporting clubs and teams. There is 14:15 actually plenty on, people just are too lazy to go, or it is not advertised properly or not to the right audience (eg, only put in the newspaper and SeaFM). I think the foreshore near the makers workshop could be a really benefitial area for Burnie also. It would be much more attractive if the car parking was moved and the whole area was park land (grass, bike tracks, trees). The area is prime land and is currently an eyesore. It would also help to link the Surf Club area to the Burnie Park. The beach front is Burnie's main asset. I think more businesses should be encouraged to open Sunday (at least the morning) when there is a cruise boat in also. I don't have children, but I feel Burnie also lacks some entertainment, there is no indoor play centre, no mini golf, no ten pin bowling, etc. Maybe some entertainment like this could open in an ideal location (CBD or waterfront area)."

"Burnie is a great place to live except every time I walk through the town with my daughter we passively inhale SO MUCH nicotine from people smoking in the streets! This seriously affects our ability to breathe, to utilise the shops that we need (especially when there is a crowd of smoking people right outside the entrance to supermarkets, the chemist, and on the stretch by the bus stops outside the Reject Shop), and enjoy the place where we live. It's crazy that these people are often smoking right underneath NO SMOKING signs, and yet Burnie Council does nothing at all to enforce these rules. Another health related issue is the amount of weedkiller 2017-(Glyphosate, which is being heavily critised by scientists as being responsible for a number of 10-15 chronic and deadly illnesses and is being found in our food and water) that Burnie Council, 12:49 tenants, and farmers are spraying everywhere. It is a toxic substance and yet is used prolifically in public spaces, drainage areas, and fields right next to waterways, which is against legislation. Many Councils around Australia have found non-toxic alternatives to this weedkiller, and considering Tasmania has a higher percentage of chronic disease, respiratory conditions, and birth defects such as Plagiocephaly, Burnie Council should be proactive in changing its approach to these two major health issues which affect its residents on a daily basis, simply due to lack of education and inaction."





7. How do you see the progress of Burnie as a city?





8. Do you shop in the CBD?








